

JR WORLD CUP – TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Check-in All teams must check in at least 30 minutes before their first game.
2. Player eligibility Players must play only in the age category they are registered for. Proof of age may be requested at any time.
3. Game format Each game will be 2 halves of 20 minutes with a short halftime.
4. Minimum players A team must have the minimum number of players required to start. If not, the game may be declared a forfeit.
5. Referee authority Referee decisions are final. Disrespect toward referees, staff, or opponents will not be tolerated.
6. Sportsmanship Coaches, players, and parents must show good sportsmanship at all times. Fighting, abusive language, or unsportsmanlike behavior may result in removal from the event.
7. Cards and discipline Yellow and red cards will be enforced. A player sent off with a red card may be suspended for the next match or removed from the tournament depending on the situation.
8. Sideline behavior Only rostered coaches and players are allowed in the team area. Parents and spectators must remain in designated areas.
9. Uniforms Teams should wear matching uniforms. If colors conflict, one team may be asked to wear pinnies.
10. Schedule responsibility Teams are responsible for checking their game times and field assignments. Games may start early if possible.
11. Grace period A short grace period may be allowed, but

the tournament will stay on schedule. Late arrival may result in a forfeit.

12. Weather delays Games may be delayed, suspended, or canceled due to weather or unsafe field conditions. Tournament staff decisions are final.
13. No refunds Registration fees are non-refundable, unless determined otherwise by tournament organizers.
14. Awards Trophies/medals will be awarded as announced by the tournament.
15. Tournament authority Tournament organizers reserve the right to make final decisions on all matters not covered in these rules.
